

ACADEMIC STANDARDS AND STUDENT PROGRESS

Portland Community College defines academic “good standing” as maintaining a cumulative 2.0 or higher grade point average (GPA). PCC will notify students when they are not in good standing.

In order to receive a degree or certificate from PCC, a student must have a cumulative 2.0 GPA at the point of graduation.

In general, PCC as an institution will not limit a student’s access to course registration based on their academic standing. However, the consequences of not passing classes can vary, depending on specific program, curricular, or financial aid requirements.

For students receiving financial aid, see Financial Aid Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP).

For international students with an F1 Visa, see International Student F1 Visa Status.
